Coolum District Coast Care Group is a volunteer-based community group with over 140 members, many of whom are active. CDCCG has been incorporated since 2000 and is well respected within the Sunshine Coast community. CDCCG projects include but are not limited to: 7weekly bush regeneration sites from Stumers Dunes to Mudjimba, co-managing Coolum Community Native Nursery, monitoring marine turtle nesting and stranding between Sunshine Beach and Mooloolah River, monthly marine debris surveys in four sites, shared management responsibility for the protection and enhancement of the road reserve from Coolum Beach to Point Arkwright. By working with the community, like organisations and governing bodies, CDCCG aims to preserve the native flora and flora in our district.
